I was busy shopping for a common item (running shoes) when I ran across this quote and was taken by it. So often the pace of life leads to a passive approach to living. Things happen and many times my focus is to react rather than pursue ideas and goals. Is inspiration just a prompt to cause action towards a higher goal?

I am inspired to achieve the best care for my patients, my nursing staff, for institutional outcomes and SOHN. How do I know my care is the best for the patient's problem and visit? Evidence-based nursing practices provide a standard and fund of knowledge for many ORL complaints. When possible, knowing the guidelines and practice parameters can help successfully transit the patient through the ORL visit. How do I know my care was appropriate and successful? An objective assessment of the visit is necessary with a set of metrics that gauge the outcomes. The various measures of patient satisfaction are an additional objective assessment of the visit/stay.

As a management nurse knowing my nursing staff is qualified inspires me. The staff can demonstrate this by becoming a CORLN, obtaining an advanced degree in nursing and always with life-long learning. Our organization is following this

observation. SOHN's membership remains constant but the number of certified nurses in the specialty is creeping toward 200! That inspires me.

What inspires you? Examine those individuals or concepts that have inspired you. Make a list. Why did they touch you? Was it one who focused on a thing, topic, idea or effort until they became an expert, authority, experienced or acquired a level of understanding not seen in the casual observer? A good friend and colleague recently inspired me by initiating lifestyle changes towards improving her health.

To inspire is to allow others the ability to see or understand the focus. I'm inspired by the Boston Marathon champion but I can't run that fast. I can focus and train hard until I can do something not thought possible by me 4-5 years ago. Does the champion inspire me to run to qualify or does the effort to qualify do it? Inspiration and difficulty in the accomplishment seem to be paired.

What inspires you in nursing? Is it helping a patient get better or knowing you work with qualified nursing staff? Does a knowledgeable staff that you can trust inspire you? Do you bring out effort from your staff members? Are many just comfortable going to work and not giving everything needed? Do they stretch outside their comfort zone? What can the leaders in nursing do to get staff up to speed as positive role models? If the staff does not see motivation in leadership they may not pursue excellence. The leader helps

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draw out the example of the certified professional nurse by applying compassion and the staff member's gifts and knowledge to benefit patients and families. The unlicensed nonprofessional can encounter the patient, enter the patient into the healthcare system but cannot provide extensive teaching, assessment, advice and care for patients from an ORL knowledge base perspective. That's the difference. You as an ORL nurse can!

Lift your focus from the activity and hectic pace of everyday lives and look to see and strive for inspiration. I achieved great inspiration reading the poem entitled "If" by Rudyard Kipling who was starved of love and attention as a child but achieved fame quickly with his poems and stories. He received the Nobel Prize for Literature in 1907. Here is an excerpt from "If"

*If you can dream-and not make your
dreams master,
If you can think-and not make
thoughts your aim;*

*If you can meet with Triumph and
Disaster
And treat those two imposters just
the same;
If you can bear to hear the truth
you've spoken
Twisted by knaves to make a trap for
fools,
Or watch the things you gave your life
to, broken,
And stoop and build 'em up with
worn-out tools*


