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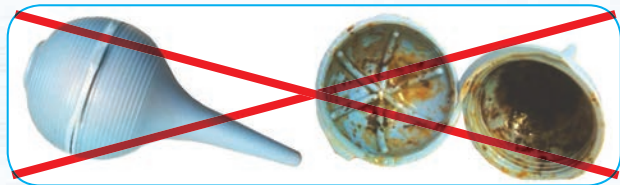

Ten Top Things to Do in San Diego

1. San Diego Zoo: Pandas, koalas and more! A place of wonder since 1916, the San Diego Zoo gives visitors a glimpse into the lives of some of the rarest animals and plants on earth. World famous and deservedly so.
2. Wild Animal Park: You know the city is far behind when you enter San Diego Zoo's Wild animal Park! Experience a unique adventure at the Wild Animal Park's 2100 acre preserve where animals wander freely in surroundings much like their native homelands. A quiet railway, pathways and shows enable you to observe both animals and exotic plants.

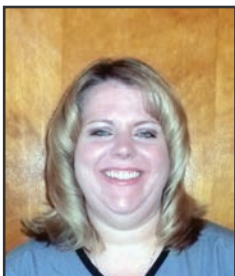
